Charity Racket Can Be Halted Through Model City Ordinance

Evelyn Spaulding, General Manager, Social Service Department, Room 1302, City Hall, 200 N. Spring St., Los Angeles, Telephone Michigan 5211, works under the direction of the Los Angeles Social Service Commission, and enforces Ordinance No. 77,000, which I recommend as a model for all city, county, and state governments that wish to control the solicitation of money for alleged charities. In popular terms, Evelyn Spaulding is the Chief Charity Racket Buster of the City of Los Angeles.

How I Met Evelyn
I met Evelyn several years ago. She is a very attractive woman. I feel qualified to pass judgment on the charm of females because I am married to a very attractive woman. I have never said that my Dorothy is beautiful, because that is not the correct word for her. She is "striking," "charming," etc. Having got this off my chest,

microphone on a radio or television station, and then pushed back on the streets to "fall" again. I decided that whole thing was a racket and asked the Los Angeles Police Department to tell me the name of the person who could tell me to see Evelyn and even those big, burly, tough cops said: "She is so good looking you must try hard to remember what you came for."

Religious Rackets
Evelyn said that the most difficult rackets to bust are those which operate under the cloak of religion. It may not be recognized, regular church. It may be a phony church set up by a self-ordained minister who uses the so-called church as a front to raise money. For example, the organization may be called "Salvation Militia," or something which has a name resembling that of the Salvation Army.

Salvation Army
Fred Steiner, whom I knew when I was a student at the University High School in Iowa City, and during my years at the State University of Iowa, came to California and I knew him then as a lawyer in San Diego. On "D" Day, he was a Lieutenant Colonel of Infantry commanding a battalion that landed on the beaches of Normandy. After the landing, and before advancing against some hedgerows, he sat down and wrote me a letter which began:

"Dear Charlie: You will be glad to know that the doughnut-and-coffee trucks of the Salvation Army are following close behind the assault waves. They have sound equipment which constantly plays 'Onward Christian Soldiers' as our troops go forward to death and glory. Now I want to tell you..."
Lieutenant Colonel Fred Steiner never finished that letter. The Army censor wrote: "Your friend was killed while trying to finish this letter."

Here and now, I am glad to say that the Salvation Army is one great charitable organization which has never been accused of irregularities. With

that out of the way, I can get back to Evelyn Spaulding and her charity racket-busting.

Truth, Honesty and Equity

Under Los Angeles City Ordinance No. 77,000, the key words are "Truth, honesty and equity." A notice of intent must be filed 10 days before the date of the commencement of a fund-raising drive. There are 22 questions which must be answered. Some of these questions are divided into sub-questions. If these are answered satisfactorily, and other requirements are met, a permit is issued. Then 30 days after the fund-raising campaign ends, the organization must give a detailed report showing where and how the money was raised and where and how it was spent. This report is audited to be sure it is truthful.

Limit on Expenses

The American Red Cross, Community Chest, and other national, recognized charity organizations are not allowed to spend more than 15 per cent of their receipts for operating expenses and overhead. In Los Angeles, benefits, dances, and similar local affairs to raise money for charity may be permitted to spend 50 per cent of their receipts for food, music, entertainment, etc., but the 50 per cent limit is not always allowed.

Drives Cost Less

The average cost of raising money for major charity drives, such as the Red Cross, was about 14.34 in Los Angeles, which is about 49 per cent lower than the average cost for such drives throughout the United States. In most cities, the costs average between 16 per cent and 28 per cent for ethical, recognized drives.
