Salvation Army Center Calls For Children's Used Clothing

A plea to local residents for castoff children's clothing to meet the heavy demands from low-income families for the fall school term was made this week by the local Salvation Army Social Center which serves the Torrance area.

In addition to helping needy families, it provides work, food and shelter to handicapped men who recondition the clothing. This occupational therapy program is dependent upon salvage materials, according to Brigadier William J. Parkins, manager of the center.

He reports the local center needs a continuous inflow of men's and women's clothing, shoes, furniture, dishes, mattresses, bedding, kitchen utensils, home appliances, silverware, stoves, radios and miscellaneous items.

In relating the full scope of this work, Brigadier Parkins further points out that the Salvation Army has always been a non-profit organization. All funds from their stores, above actual operating costs, are re-


