'Speed Kills' CHP Reports To Motorists

"Speed kills and it's time to kill that speed."

So says California Highway Patrol Commissioner B. R. Caldwell, who announced this week that Patrol enforcement officers throughout the state are intensifying speed enforcement activities as part of the Patrol's fight to reduce traffic accidents.

Caldwell stated that during the first eight months of 1954 approximately one-third of all traffic accidents in the unincorporated areas of the state were traced directly to speed violations.

"The Highway Patrol is dedicated to making the highways safe for all motorists. In order to do this job thoroughly, it is obvious that we are going to have to bring pressure to bear against all traffic violators, particularly speeders. This is exactly what we intend to do," he declared.

In making the announcement, Caldwell emphasized the importance of all motorists respecting the speed limits during the coming Labor Day week-end. Every available officer will be on duty with instructions to enforce speed laws in every instance, he said.
