POLICE SEARCH HILLS; LATER NAB BOY BANDIT

A 14-year-old Walteria boy and two 15-year-old reform school escapes were in custody yesterday after they were nabbed in a stolen car, several hours after leading police on a chase through the Walteria hills. Another car, presumably stolen by the same boys, was found abandoned after a resident frightened them away when he observed the vandals attempting to break into his own auto. Gets License Number. Police said Robert E. Ward, of 22423 Los Codona Ave., Walteria, reported he saw two boys trying to break into his car. He ran outside, got their license number, and they drove away. Their auto, listed as stolen from Long Beach, was found nearby. Still later, the boys were believed seen in the nearby Palos Verdes Hills above Walteria. Torrance police and a patrol car from Palos Verdes Estates searched the area but the youthful thieves were not found. Long Beach authorities picked up the boys Tuesday night after receiving an all-points bulletin from Torrance reporting a car had just been stolen from 3776 Pacific Coast Hwy., Walteria. Owner of the auto is Frank Vajo, of the same address. Torrance juvenile officer, Sergeant D. C. Cook, said yesterday he will seek a "detention" order against the Walteria boy. He reportedly has a long police record. The other boys were listed as escapes from Rancho San Antonio and Pacific Lodge detention homes.






