


Rice Bags Will Collect Special Korean Offering

As a part of worship services emphasizing emergency needs in Korea, the First Methodist Church will collect its Sunday offering in miniature rice bags, the Rev. John L. Taylor has announced.

These rice bags are symbols of the sacrificial offerings of rice which Koreans have donated to rebuild war-ravaged churches, he said.

Morning services will be at 9 and 11 a.m.

Seventy per cent of the receipts from the offering will be administered through the denomination's Division of World Missions, and 30 per cent through the Methodist Committee for Overseas Relief.
