

APACHES WIN TITLE

Samohi Scores But Loses, 13-6

Centennial High's Apaches settled the Bay League grid title question Friday night when they turned back Santa Monica, 13-6, to clinch the 1954 Championship.

Samohi accomplished a feat which no other Apache opponent had been able to do this season, when the Vikings marched 80 yards in the third period to cross the Centennial goal line. Previously, the Apaches had boasted a perfect defensive state in going seven straight games without being scored on.

The Apaches now have scored 206 points in eight tilts, while yielding only six.

Santa Monica dropped into a second place tie with Torrance by losing to Centennial.

Battle Looms
The stage now is set for Friday's encounter between the Vikings and Tartars here when the battle for second place in the Bay League will be settled.

Friday's tilt will be the final game of the season for both teams.

Torrance drew a well-deserved bye last week and should be in top shape for the Samohi invasion.

Paul Lowe counted both touchdowns for the Apaches, slipping let and hanging over again from four yards out in the final period. Andrews added the extra point after the first score for Centennial.

El Camino In 33-7 Win Over Harbor

El Camino went on a five-touchdown scoring spurge to bury Harbor Junior College, 33-7, in a Metropolitan Conference game Saturday night at El Camino.

The victorious Warriors scored six points each in the first two quarters, a safety in the third period, and broke loose for 19 points in the final frame. Harbor scored its only counter in the third period, when Bob Bolden returned a Warrior kickoff 85 yards to paydirt. It was only the second touchdown yielded this season by El Camino.

The win kept El Camino at the top of the Metro standings, still tied with the powerful Bakersfield Renegades. Bakersfield edged San Diego, 24-21, in a thriller Saturday night.

A second quarter field goal by Walt Napier was the margin of victory for the Renegades, who now own a 24-game winning streak.

Joe Contestable passed the Harbor crew dizzy, as he completed 12 of 19 pitches. He threw two touchdown passes, one for 13 yards to Norton Engen, and one for 17 yards to end Norm Becker.

Both Bakersfield and the Warriors still are undefeated. Barring a defeat to either team this week-end, their big meeting Thanksgiving Day at El Camino should find them still without a loss.

El Camino takes on tough East Los Angeles Friday night, with the Warriors being the home team. Santa Monica City College hosts Bakersfield, also this Friday night, in the other top Metro game.

TWO TARTARS SHATTER SCHOOL DISTANCE MARK

The Torrance High cross-country team runs its final 1954 dual meet tomorrow at 2:45 p.m. when the Tartar harriers host Inglewood's long distance team.

So far this season, Coach Willard Morgan's runners have suffered defeat only once in a dual meet, succumbing to Mira Costa, 25-30.

Torrance holds wins over Santa Monica, Centennial, Narbonne and Redondo in a pair of three-way meets.

Seniors Jim Stanford and Jerry Buchholz both broke the local school record in a recent meet. Stanford shattered the old record of 8:46.0 by almost 15 seconds in touring the 1.7 mile distance in 8:31.9. Buchholz ran an 8:34.6 in the same race, also bettering the previous mark, held by Bob Guerra.

The harriers are pointing for the Bay League Finals, which will be held Nov. 23 at Inglewood's Centennial Park. The Tartars are defending titles, having won the Bay League crown for the past two years.

Medals will go to the first 15 finishers and a team trophy will be awarded to the school with the lowest score.

CIF HAS NEW RULE ON GRID PLAY-OFFS

If Torrance's Tartars can get by Santa Monica Friday in the final game of the season here, the locals may stand a chance of being invited to participate in the Southern Section CIF play-offs.

According to a ruling handed down this year by the CIF, certain second place teams may be selected to play in the CIF finals, following the wind-up of league seasons.

Coach Cliff Graybehl of Torrance says the rule was made to eliminate the large number of byes usually prominent in the play-offs, and also to give more teams a shot at the Southern Section title.

Graybehl says the CIF selection committee probably will choose second place teams from some of the stronger leagues, in putting the new rule into practice.

Graybehl says the Bay League always has been regarded as a "strong league," although he believes the circuit has not been as powerful of late as it has been in the past.

Santa Monica and Torrance are now tied for second place in Bay League standings. Friday's game should figure as important for both schools, even though the bid to CIF recognition is not certain.

The play-offs usually begin about the last week in November, according to the Tartar mentor.
