# Observance of Anniversary Of Bill of Rights Planned

Schools, government offices, courts, civic and fraternal organizations will observe the 14th local Bill of Rights Week, Dec. 9 to 15, to commemorate the 163rd anniversary of the ratification of the historic American document.

The much discussed 14th Amendment, one of the ten which was ratified on Dec. 15, 1791, will be highlighted this year. Others are to be featured in coming years, it was pointed out.

Particular attention will be paid to the section of the Amendment which has drawn much debate in recent years; "No person shall be compelled in any criminal case to be a witness against himself."

Fifth Amendment Studied applies to alleged subversives self-incrimination, especially as it applies to some of the nation's leading legal minds on prosecution, are included in a Bill of Rights program and speakers manual. The manual has been furnished

to schools and speakers. Civic Leader Joe Crall heads a 23-man Bill of Rights Committee which will guide the observance.

Churches of all denominations will participate on Saturday, Dec. 11, and Sunday, Dec. 12, with special sermons, it was announced.

Special readings on the Bill of Rights will open court proceedings on Wednesday, Dec. 15. On the same day a pageant depicting historical scenes connected with the ratification of the Bill will be given in the chambers of the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors.

## Use the Dump, Officials Urge

Open hours of the Torrance City Dump were announced this week, in a reminder that old Christmas trees and trimmings should be discarded in a safe manner, avoiding back-yard blazes and rubbish piles.

The dump, located one-quarter mile north of Torrance Blvd. on the east side of Madrona Ave., is open seven days a week. Weekdays, hours are 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. On weekdays and holidays, the dump opens at 7 a.m., but closes at 4 p.m.

There is no dumping fee for those residing within the city limits. A small fee is charged for commercial dumpers and those who reside outside Torrance.
