Chairman Urges Chest Wind-Up

Declaring that "you can't give a child only 90 per cent of a chance," Red Feather Chairman Tommy Thompson this week urged full cooperation in making it a 100 per cent by bringing the current Community Chest campaign to a complete close.

Victory for the entire Los Angeles area appeal was in sight for the first time since the war years, according to Campaign Chairman Jack Fishburn, who said that 90 per cent of the over-all \$8,652,000 goal was in hand at the beginning of the week.

In Torrance, another \$700 reported by Sam Levy and Warren Hamilton increased the local commerce and industry division quota to 89 per cent, just three points behind the residential unit's 92 per cent quota. Total contributions for Torrance tallied \$16,689—representing 92 per cent of the total city goal.

The Harbor area, according to Thompson, had to relinquish its lead among the Associated Cities area for the first time since the beginning of the campaign, when San Fernando Valley reported an 89 per cent quota this week. The following figures are submitted for the Harbor area,—now in second place:

Residential: \$45,264, 87 per cent of \$52,161 goal.
Commerce and Industry: \$22,230—64 per cent of \$32,529 quota
Total: \$75,695, 77 per cent of \$85,000 area goal.


