Favorite Recipes

Glorified Angel Cake is Popular for Yule Season

"For the busy homemaker who loves to have company for dinner, there is nothing better than an elegant dessert that can be prepared ahead of time," says Mrs. C. Albert Smith, 1608 Hickory Ave., "and that is why this Glorified Angel Cake is a favorite of mine. It may be prepared a day before except for the frosting of the cake. And the garnish of red and green cherries makes it very appropriate for the holiday season too."

For six years, Mrs. Smith was a seventh grade teacher in the Torrance School System, teaching at Fern Ave. and Greenwood schools. She was also active in the teachers association, serving as secretary. She is a life member of the National Education Association and Kappa Delta Pi, national honorary education fraternity.

Attending Florida Southern College at Lakeland, Fla., Mrs. Smith was graduated as salutatorian of her class and was listed in the Who's Who among students in American universities and Colleges, 1944-45.

She is the mother of six-week-old Robin Lynn and is president of the Torrance Junior Woman's Club. Her favorite recipe is as follows:

- GLORIFIED ANGEL CAKE**
BEAT 6 egg yolks until lemon colored.
ADD ¾ cup sugar gradually.
ADD 1½ tsp. lemon rind, ¾ cup lemon juice.
PUT into double boiler and cook until mixture coats spoon.
Set off fire.
SOFTEN 1½ envelopes gelatin in ¼ cup cold water.
ADD egg mixture to gelatin mixture.
PUT into refrigerator and stir occasionally until slightly thickened and cool.
MEANWHILE, cut angel food cake into 1 inch cubes.
BEAT 6 egg whites until almost stiff.
ADD ¾ cup of sugar to egg whites and beat until stiff.
FOLD beaten egg whites into cool egg yolk mixture.
PUT some in bottom of an angel food cake pan.
COAT pieces of angel food cake with mixture and REMOLD in angel food cake pan.
CHILL cake.
FROST cake with whipped cream and garnish with red and green cherries.
