Introduced to the council by Councilman Albert Isert, the ordinance came as the aftermath of appeals from PTA and parent groups, and report of a survey conducted in a Torrance school which was printed in the HERALD.

Isert urged his colleagues to adopt the ordinance to protect the morals of children of the "impressionable age." The ordinance does not, of course, apply to accounts of news which are part of the ordinary and general dissemination of news.

Along with the adoption of the ordinance, the Council instructed City Attorney James M. Hall to draw up a resolution urging state legislation banning the sale of such material throughout the state.

Upon adoption, the resolution will be sent to the governor, members of the State Legislature, and other public officials.


