Atomic Program To Produce Heat
 An atomic energy program designed to produce heat is now under study at North American Aviation, Inc., R. A. Lambeth, vice-president and treasurer, said Monday.
 The program, financed by the company and the federal government, is designed to furnish heat, and at present, engineers are working on a plant which would create heat for a city of 20,000 people.
 Explaining the expansion of the aircraft industry, he pointed out that his company works almost exclusively on government aircraft.
Outlook Is Good
 Airplane work, he expects, will remain good for the present, but may diminish somewhat when the planned 187-group Air Force is reached.
 The F-100, grounded recently because of a series of crashes, is still in production, he said, while engineers are investigating the causes.
 "Our general feeling is that the crashes were unrelated," he said.
 Work equivalent to full-time work for 800 engineers for one year was put in developing a recent new model of a North American aviation airplane.
Missile Work Set
 In order to develop newer models, 6000 persons are employed in airplane development and engineering departments, and 5000 in missile work at North American, he said.
 He pointed out how production costs and necessities have expanded tremendously since 1940. Now, \$500,000 worth of machine tools are needed to do a job on wing construction that could have been done with \$50 rivet guns in 1940.
