GI Enrollment At El Camino Reaches 1000

With thousands of veterans enrolling in Southern California colleges each new semester, fall enrollment at El Camino College included 1000 veterans of the second World War and the recent Korean conflict, studying under the GI Bill of Rights.
 College officials anticipate that 300 more veterans will begin their studies when the

spring semester starts on Feb. 8. This new enrollment figure of 1300 former servicemen has prompted the addition of an additional veterans clerk to aid Miss Dorothy Plummer already assisting campus GIs.
 With the ending of the GI Bill of Rights under the Korean Emergency Act, the enrollment of veterans in colleges and other institutions of learning

in Southern California will begin to taper off gradually, but the peak of GI enrollments is anticipated next September, when an estimated one million more veterans will be eligible for schooling.
 Released Early
 This peak of enrollment is being prompted by the government's early release of non-strategic service personnel. A

recent poll of servicemen ready for discharge found a great percentage of them planning to begin college after their separation.
 Almost half of the veterans currently enrolled at El Camino College are Californians. The other half represent each of the other 47 states in the Union. Noel F. Sloan, director of student personnel at the college, explains that many of the out-of-state veterans have heard of El Camino College from as far away as French Morocco, and that vets have found California institutions of higher learning

liberal in requirements for entrance while maintaining high standards of learning.
 Many of the veterans, upon graduation with an Associate of Arts degree from El Camino, will go on to upper division work in Southern California colleges and universities.

 The Torrance YMCA Gra-Y "Bombardment" League will begin at the high school girls' gym Saturday morning, at 9 o'clock, and run for six weeks. Each Gra-Y Club will play a match consisting of the best three out of five games each Saturday morning.

 The game is similar to dodgeball.

Red Flashing Light Means Stop --- CHP

Flashing red lights on a school bus mean "Stop."
 This warning was reiterated today by the California Highway Patrol as they reviewed the record of citations issued during 1954.
 "Although speed and driving too fast again led in the number of violations cited, there was an increasing number of drivers who seemed to misunderstand the school bus law," Patrol Commissioner B. R. Caldwell declared. "The law requires motorists to stop when approaching a stopped school bus with red lights flashing and to wait until the red lights stop flashing before proceeding."
 "During 1954 the Patrol cited almost 1700 motorists for failing to heed the flashing red lights on stopped school buses," the commissioner continued. "With slightly different circumstances each of these violations could have taken the life of one or more school children."
 "The law is plain and requires all drivers approaching from either direction to stop when meeting a school bus with red lights flashing. The only exception is when the bus is on the opposite portion of a divided highway. Obey this regulation and help us protect our school children," he concluded.


