Northrop Has Dental Week Set in March Group Plan Of Insurance

Approximately 22,000 personnel at Northrop Aircraft, Inc., will receive free health insurance beginning Feb. 28. Whitley C. Collins, Northrop president, announced Monday.

Through major revisions in Northrop's present group insurance plan, Collins said, all personnel employed by the firm will automatically receive, at company expense, hospital, surgical and major medical expense insurance, \$5000 life insurance and \$5000 accidental death or dismemberment insurance.

Northrop's chief executive said changes in other phases of the company's already broad coverage program will result in substantial increases in benefits. In addition, he said Northrop personnel will be able to increase their own coverage and obtain complete health insurance, including major medical coverage, for their dependents at a relatively low additional cost.

In addition to an overall cost reduction, other major changes in Northrop's new insurance plan include increase in hospital payments from \$13 per day for 31 days to \$20 daily for 100 days; more than double special charge limitations which are increased from \$260 to \$600; raise in maximum surgical coverage from \$300 to \$400; reduction in the cost of disability insurance and a new provision for \$300 supplemental accident coverage.

With the slogan, "Fewer Sweets Mean Better Teeth," plans are being made to observe Dental Health Week from March 7 to 11. Paul Diamond, local Dental Health Assn chairman, announced Monday.

The local observance will be sponsored by the third district of the Los Angeles County Dental Society, headed by Dr. Arthur Berke. Speakers, films, and literature will be available on request through Diamond.

Various dental diseases can be readily prevented, Diamond said, but generally grows in proportion of the increased consumption of sweets in all forms. This fact has led to the adoption of this year's slogan.
