Dr. Jauncey to Deliver Nightly Baptist Sermons

Dr. James H. Jauncey will deliver a series of talks on "Psychology and Christian Living," at the First Baptist Church nightly except Saturday from March 6 to 13, the Rev. C. Miles Northrup has announced. A professor of religion and theology at the California Baptist Seminary at Covina, Dr. Jauncey will speak at 7:30 weekdays and at 10:30 on Sundays. HERITAGE TOPIC OF SERMON

"Lo, this only have I found, that God hath made man upright. In this declaration of man's righteousness and true heritage is the Golden Text from Ecclesiastes (7:29) in the Sunday Lesson—Sermon on "Man" in all Christian Science churches.

A Scriptural citation from Matthew (8:7,8,13) records that when the centurion came beseeching Jesus to heal his servant who lay sick of the palsy, Jesus said, "I will come and heal him." The centurion answered and said, Lord, I am not worthy that thou shouldst come under my roof: but speak the word only, and my servant shall be healed. And Jesus said unto the centurion, Go thy way; and as thou hast believed, so be it done unto thee. And his servant was healed in the selfsame hour. "Man, created by God, was given dominion over the whole earth," declares Mary Baker Eddy in "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures." Again she says, "Mortals will some day assert their freedom in the name of Almighty God. Then they will control their own bodies through the understanding of divine Science." (pp. 545, 288)


