

### ECC Baseball Nine Heads for Azusa Tourney

El Camino's baseball team will make its bid for the championship of the Azusa tournament when it takes the field against a tough Ventura squad at Azusa Thursday.

Boasting a Metropolitan Conference record of two wins and one loss in the first three conference games, Coach Loug Essick will probably call on the strong right arm of Gary Marks for mound duty against the Pirates.

The relative positions of the ball to the stance of the feet vary according to the type of shot to be taken, and the terrain in which the ball lies.

On uphill lies, the ball is played off the left toe with the weight on the left foot. The club used should be one with a more upright lie, as the left of the face of the club is increased when standing on an uphill lie.

On hill lies, where the ball is below your stance position the ball should be between the feet. The golfer should stand closer to the ball in this case, to allow for drifting or slicing.

On downhill lies, play the ball off the right foot and keep your weight back of the ball or on your right leg.

In putting, it must be remembered that the grip used by most good putters is the one which features the reverse overlap. In explanation, the index finger of the left hand overlaps the little finger of the right hand.

This way the wrists oppose each other, keeping the club face open and on the true line of stroke.

Putting stance should be by a triangular method. The left foot is on the base line, at right angles to the hole or apex of the triangle.
