

Palm Sunday Observance Slated at Local Churches

Light of World Named as Topic of Sunday Talk

A public lecture, "Christianity or Christianity—Which One Is the Light of the World?" will be delivered at 3 p. m. Sunday at 1214 El Prado by George Kezar, local presiding minister of the Jehovah's Witnesses.

The message will be part of a special campaign of the 900,000 Jehovah's Witnesses in all parts of the world.

After the discourse, a new 32-page booklet will be distributed. The contents of the booklet have not been disclosed, but Mr. Kezar described them as "unique and of interest to persons of all faiths."



UNREALITY IS SUBJECT OF SUNDAY'S SERMON

The Lesson-Sermon on "Unreality" in each Christian Science Church, Sunday, illustrates how the spiritually real exposes and neutralizes all forms of evil. Jeremiah declares in the Golden Text: "O Jerusalem, wash thine heart from wickedness, that thou mayest be saved. How long shall thy vain lodge within thee?" (Jer. 4:14)

Foursquare Church Will Have Slides


