A giant display of prospecting, drilling, refining, and transporting operations in oil was set up, with explanations of various types of class work involved, by Mrs. Pool and seven students, Linda Sweet, Sharon Brase, Marilyn Johnston, Johnny Underwood, Butch Cowan, Roger Foreman, and Danny Kirks.

The youngsters told the audience that in making up the display, they had done considerable reading on the subject, from history, to more technical aspects. They wrote letters to oil companies to get more information, and toured a Wilmington refinery.

After they returned, they made graphs and wrote reports on what they found, and the boys built the models of the

3 Bound Over For Robbery


