

New Air Force Reserve Center Wants Enlistees

Opportunities for pay, promotion and retirement now are available for Air Force reservists in the western half of the Los Angeles area, since the activities this week of the 2563rd Air Reserve Center, with headquarters on the grounds of the Veterans Administration Center, Sawtelle.

The new center was established on orders from Headquarters, Fourth Air Force, at Hamilton AFB. The move was necessitated because of a need for expanded facilities in the area, which serves more reservists than any other section of the nation.

Five squadrons will make up the 8076th Air Reserve Group, which will be the main body established by the order. The squadrons will be formed from personnel drawn from Hollywood, Beverly Hills, West Los Angeles, Inglewood, Culver City, Hawthorne, Santa Monica, Torrance, Redondo and other nearby communities.

Reserve officials are especially desirous of having inactive reserve personnel apply for the new group.

Program for the center will emphasize specialized training to create proficiency in every reservist.

All inactive reservists in the extended Los Angeles area are asked to contact center headquarters for information. Headquarters is located at 2563rd Air Reserve Center, Building T26, Veterans Administration Branch, Sawtelle Blvd., L.A. 55. Phone number is GRanite 3-1511.

City Approves Two New Tracts

Two tracts of 87 and 19 lots, respectively, were approved last week by Torrance City Council. The larger tract was that to be built by Norco Homes, Inc., at an area between Plaza del Amo and Lincoln Ave., east of Border Ave. Removal or fencing of oil wells in the section is provided.

Also approved was the request of Grand Construction Co. to put in 19 lots southwest of 166th St. and Arlington Ave.

Two public hearings will be held at City Hall Tuesday, July 26, on requests for zone variances.

The hearings will be held in conjunction with center board meeting at 8 p.m. in the Council chamber.

One will be on a change from R-1 to C-2 zoning for certain parcels on Anza Ave. and Carmelita St. Another will be for rezoning from A-1 to M-1 and C-2 of certain property in north Torrance south of 174 and east of Arlington Ave.

ONLOOKERS HEADACHE FOR POLICE

Curious onlookers at accidents often cause more collisions and tie up traffic, the Traffic Education Section of the Los Angeles Police Department said Friday.

Bystanders often help to tie up traffic for blocks at the scene of an accident, the department said, if they do not cause accidents themselves. During a recent bridge collapse on the Santa Ana Freeway, traffic was tied up for hours, even on the unaffected side of the freeway. In an effort to clear up some of the confusion, the department offered the following rules:

1. Stop only if you witness an accident or can render immediate necessary assistance.
2. Obey the directions of police officers at the scene of an accident.
3. Keep a normal, safe speed where vehicles involved in an accident have been removed from the road, unless traffic controls are present.
4. Avoid unnecessary slow down on any street or freeway.
5. If on a freeway, use the nearest exit. If there is an obvious traffic congestion ahead.
