## Optometrists Reveal Plan To Check Hunter's Vision

Over 700 California optometrists, representing 235 cities and towns, will participate in a state-wide public service campaign to conduct minimum vision safety checks on hunters before the opening of the 1955 season. The examinations, which are sponsored by the California Optometric Assn., are offered on a voluntary basis to hunter safety instructors and their students, and are intended to reduce the accident rate among California hunters.

A recent California law prescribes a course of training in the safe handling of firearms for all persons under the age of 16 years who have not previously held a hunting license. This Hunter Safety Training Program is being conducted by the State Department of Fish and Game, in cooperation with the National Rifle Assn. The California Optometric Assn.'s vision safety check has been officially accepted as part of this state-wide program.

**Cause of Accidents**  
Optometric study has disclosed that poor vision consistently accounts for a considerable percentage of hunting accidents, according to the Vision Conservation Institute.

The Institute lists three major

skills necessary to safe hunting: (1) Ability to recognize fine details under all weather conditions; (2) Ability to recognize colors and to distinguish one from another accurately; (3) Ability to see objects to the right and left of a target while keeping eyes fixed on the target. Safety officials have requested each hunter to be aware of his visual capacity and to take precautions to hunt within those limitations.

**Minimum Safety Check**  
The program will work this way: Whenever a hunter safety instructor encounters a junior hunter who is apparently suffering from defective vision, the hunter will be referred to a member of the association in his locality for a free minimum safety check. The examination will include tests for visual acuity, peripheral vision and balance, and will determine if corrective action should be taken to assist the hunter in obtaining proper vision for safe hunting.

Although this campaign is primarily aimed at the younger hunters who are participating in the training program, the vision examination will be available to any hunter who wishes to take advantage of the program. Each hunter who takes the examination will be given a visual record card by the examining optometrist. California Optometric Assn. officials emphasized that this program is a minimum vision safety check and not a complete visual analysis.

## Driver Class At Hawthorne

A new daytime class in driver education will begin Aug. 1 at Hawthorne High School, according to an announcement this week by officials of the Centinela Valley Union High School District.

Persons wishing to register for the class should plan to attend the first session, set for 11 a.m., Aug. 1, where registration is scheduled. The class will be held in Building 3, Room 1. Class lectures will last from 11 a.m. to noon, Monday through Thursday, during the four-week course. A \$5 fee will be charged for registration.

A night class, beginning at 7 p.m., Aug. 1, will be held in the same room. The same registration fee and procedure have been set for this course.
