

Enroll Early, Schools Urge

Elementary schools of the Torrance Unified School District will be open for new enrollments about Sept. 1. It is suggested that children be enrolled between Sept. 1 and 9 rather than to wait for the beginning of school on Sept. 14. Children who were enrolled in Torrance Schools last year need not register this year. A child must have been born on or before Dec. 2, 1950 if he is to enter the first grade. A birth certificate is needed for proof of birth for all kindergarten and first grade new enrollees. Enrollments can be made at in Torrance Schools last year.

Twenty Top Teenage Books Picked by County Library

Older teenagers who love to read and who pick their books with care at the Torrance Library, 1345 Post Ave., may soon be acting as top literary critics for all young America.

County Librarian John D. Henderson said their choice of the best books published this year has a good chance of appearing on next year's "must" list for discriminating young readers in the country. That "must" list, issued annually, names the 20 adult books published the prior year that are considered the pick of the crop for older teenage readers, he explained.

The library world has a name for that age group. It is young adult. Youth to Aid, the young adult librarian of the County system, Mrs. Frances M. Greene, who was appointed chairman of the book selection committee of the Association of Young People's Librarians at the annual July conference of the American Library Assn., has said she expects to call on the young adult readers of the County Library to aid her in compiling the list for next year.

The 20 books are chosen for their readability, integrity of presentation, literary content and general appeal.
