**LEMONT FLUFF**  
4 eggs separated  
1 lemon, grated rind and juice  
1 cup sugar  
3 tbsp. lemon gelatin or one tsp. granulated gelatin  
½ cup water  
½ pt. heavy cream  
Vanilla wafers.

Beat egg yolks, add lemon juice, grated rind and ½ cup sugar, cook over boiling water until it thickens. Dissolve the lemon gelatin in ½ cup hot water or soften the granulated gelatin in ¼ cup cold water for 5 minutes, then dissolve in ¼ cup boiling water.

Add dissolved gelatin to first mixture as soon as it is cooked sufficiently, mix well, cool until it begins to congeal then mix with an egg beater. Beat egg whites until frothy, add remaining ½ cup sugar, a tsp. at a time beating well between additions. Fold carefully into gelatin mixtures with cream which has been whipped. Pour into a square pan lined with vanilla wafer crumbs and cover with a thin layer of crumbs. Chill. Serves 8.

**LEMONT FLUFF**  
4 eggs separated  
1 lemon, grated rind and juice  
1 cup sugar

Vanilla wafers.


