## 'Messiah' Presentation Planned Here on Dec. 4

"The Messiah" will be presented in Torrance, on Dec. 4, at the First Lutheran Church, Carson and Flower, Fred Lincoln, Jr., chairman for this area, announced yesterday. Frank Owen, organist and choirmaster at St. Paul's Cathedral, in Los Angeles, will conduct the local presentation of "The Messiah" here and will be one

of 65 to be presented simultaneously in various areas in Southern California. A choir of about 150 voices is expected to sing the famous work.

Tenor soloist in last year's presentation of "The Messiah," Lincoln will handle all local arrangements. He also appeared as soloist in the presentation of "The Seven Last Words of Christ" by the Redondo Methodist and has studied with Lin Branum and Vance Hayes, last year's director. He is a member of the First Christian Church choir and the South Bay Choral.

He attended Torrance High School, and Compton and El Camino Junior Colleges and now is employed as a tool and

die maker. Lincoln lives at 1229 Cota Ave., with his wife and two sons.

Owen has been organist and choirmaster at St. Paul's for the past year, directing the boys' and men's choir there at four rehearsals a week. He has directed "The Messiah" many times previously.

A former director of the largest boys' choir in the country, Owen studied at the Manchester, England, Cathedral. He has been in the United States for 32 years.

Many Torrance and Lomita choirs will appear in the presentation, Owen said, with rehearsals scheduled at 8 p.m. on Nov. 13, 20, and 27.

### Crusade Enters Last Week With 350 'Decisions' Made

Evangelist Pete Riggs, former professional gambler, enters the final phase of his scheduled 22-day united interdenominational evangelistic crusade at Pacific Coast Hwy. and Normandie Ave., with the four most important meetings of the series starting tonight at 7:30.

The young evangelist speaks tonight on "Decision of Death." On Friday evening, his scheduled final meeting, he will speak on "The Final Decision." This subject will be his life's story in the Air Force during the second World War and culminating with his acceptance of Christian faith on the eve of the opening of a new plush gambling casino at Bloomington, Ill., which he hoped would attract Chicago's gambling set.

Ventriloquist Slated

Saturday morning at 10 a.m., Ray Ton, ventriloquist, will assist the evangelist, and his party in a special "small fry" rally for pre-teen children which will also include a program featuring youthful local singers and musicians. On Saturday evening, the evangelist's 7:30 subject will be "How You Can Tell When You're In Love."

The final meeting of the crusade will be held Sunday afternoon at 3 p.m. when Riggs promises to produce documentary evidence in exposing the "biggest crook in the harbor area."

350 Decisions Made

Rev Herbert Ezell, Wilmington pastor and chairman of the crusade, announced Wednesday that more than 350 "decisions" were recorded on the "sawdust trail" during the first two weeks of the crusade and that predictions are for a total of more than 500 acceptances of Christian faith by the close of the meeting.

Services are held week nights at 7:30, Saturday mornings at 10 and Sunday afternoon at 8 when the series will close. The general public is invited. There is no admittance or parking charge.

### Sunday Topic Advises Love For Neighbor

"Walk in love, as Christ also hath loved us, and hath given himself for us an offering and a sacrifice to God for a sweet-smelling savour." This verse from Ephesians (5:2) is the Golden Text of the Lesson-Sermon "Doctrine of Atonement" in all Christian Science churches Sunday.

Paul says in his epistle to the Hebrews (5:8, 9) that Christ Jesus learned "obedience by the things which he suffered; and being made perfect, he became the author of eternal salvation unto all them that obey him."
