

Methodists Plan Series Of Programs

The first session of the annual School of Missions will be held at 6:30 p.m. this Sunday evening, at the First Methodist Church, with the general theme, "World Peace."

The Senior High Youth Fellowship and Wesley Fellowship are planning the school, which is part of their fall action project, "Toward Christian World Community."

A worship service will precede a movie, "More for Peace," which is the story of a war veteran disillusioned with the workings of democracy and the church. The movie concerns the solution to his problems.

In succeeding Sunday evening programs, the Rev. John L. Taylor will review the study book, "To Combine Our Efforts for Lasting Peace," dealing with problems involved in securing freedom from war.

A UNESCO representative will tell of the work of his organization, a foreign student will tell of his country, and a film debate on "The Christian and Pacifism" are planned in other programs.

Mormons Plan \$350,000 Chapel, Youth Center

Plans to build a \$350,000 structure at 2100 W. 174th St. which will serve as a chapel and youth center were revealed this week by representatives of the Redondo Stake of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints. The building will serve as stake center for the Redondo Stake as well as the new home for the Gardena Ward, which presently meets in the Torrance Ward Chapel.

Included in the plans are a modern gymnasium, seating 500 people for basketball and other indoor sports, an outdoor baseball diamond, and tennis courts.

For Community Use
The facilities on the four-and-three-quarter-acre plot will be available for community use, officials said.

As the kickoff in a fund-raising campaign for the project a huge chuck wagon barbecue dinner will be staged on the site of the proposed building on Nov. 12 from 3 to 10 p.m. Radio and TV stars Red Ryder, Cisco, Pancho, and others will be present for the dinner. Western music will be provided. Pony rides will be available for youngsters.

Barbecued beef will be served around an open fire and all residents are invited to attend. Merchants have contributed many door prizes, officials said, including a Shetland pony, new dishwasher, \$15 portrait setting, merchandise order from an auto dealer, and many other valuable gifts.

Tickets for the affair may be purchased at Squires' Style Shoppe in downtown Torrance. Admission is \$5 for adults, \$2.50 for children six to 12, and free for youngsters under six.

The special services will be held as follows: Sunday evening at 7 p.m., Monday through Thursday evenings of next week, at 8 p.m. Rev. Fleischmann will also speak at the morning services on this Sunday.

The following are the themes for his messages: General Text: John 3:16 and General Theme: "God's Love Is My All".
