Plane Landed Safely

What started out as a pleasure aircraft ride almost ended in tragedy here Thursday afternoon, but the alert skill of the pilot of a 1947 Piper Cruiser prevailed to bring the end to a harrowing adventure.

William K. Bradford, 32, of Huntington Park, was flying two women companions around in the Piper when the small craft's engine suddenly went dead. Bradford was credited with saving the lives of all three by Torrance police, when he brought the craft to a neat belly landing in the rear of the George Amato home, at 2904 W. 164th St.

Clean-Up Drive Opens

A citywide clean-up campaign which would be conducted on two levels has been described by City Manager George Stevens in a memorandum to the members of the City Council:

- 1. Eliminate the trash and litter that exists at the present time, and
- 2. Prevent the recurrence of a similar condition.

To accomplish the first phase of the clean-up campaign, Stevens announced that Street Superintendent Ralph Perkins will put crews to work cleaning up the shoulders of Torrance streets beginning at 190th and Crenshaw beginning Wednesday.

City Approves Dump

The County Regional Planning Commission has been notified that the City of Torrance concurs with the application for zone exception to establish a dump south of Pacific Hills in the abandoned Dicalite mine area.

The city's official approval of the variance carried three conditions, however, which should eliminate much of the local opposition if incorporated in the County's consideration:

- 1. That Hawthorne Blvd., be extended south to Palos Verdes Drive North.
- 2. That refuse trucks be restricted to using major streets and highways within the city limits of Torrance.
- 3. That all refuse trucks be required to be either of the enclosed type or covered properly to prevent refuse from spilling or blowing from the trucks enroute to the disposal areas.

A special Council meeting at which all parties interested in developing the Airport Triangle shopping center are being invited to present their plans, has been called for 7 p.m., Tuesday, Nov. 22, in the Council chambers of the City Hall.

The meeting was arranged after Store Properties, Inc., a firm which has been negotiating with the city for a lease since late last year, asked for a chance to appear before the Council to submit a new lease proposal for the area. The firm has stated that it is prepared to go ahead with the commercial development of the 35-acre parcel.




