The five sisters, Sara, Mary, Verna, Lorraine, and Pauline, render a deeply spiritual program featuring vocal quintets, soprano and alto solos, artistic piano playing, and numbers on the following instruments: vibra-harp, violin, electric Hawaiian guitar, saxophone, and accordions, among others. These five sisters are known from coast to coast, Canada, old Mexico, British Isles, and Europe. They are widely used in Youth for Christ rallies.

Lesson-Sermon Topic Sunday Is on 'Truth'
