

Douglas Employees to Get Increased Income in 1957

More than 7000 salaried employees of Douglas Aircraft Co. will have their incomes increased from 4 to 7 per cent, effective Jan. 7.

The increases were awarded to all salaried employees other than those represented by the Southern California Professional Engineering Assn.

Parallel upward adjustments will be forthcoming to the approximately 3400 employees represented by SCPEA when the formula is approved by the membership of that organization.

Increases going into effect Jan. 7 will involve employees at the five Douglas divisions in Santa Monica, El Segundo, Long Beach, Tulsa and Charlotte, N. C.

Approximately 1900 El Segundo division employees at the El Segundo and Torrance locations will receive the salary increases.



According to County building sources, a petition was filed with the Boundary Commission Dec. 14 by Richard Person who gave his address as the Hermosa Biltmore Hotel in Hermosa Beach. A tentative hearing on the petition is scheduled for Jan. 16.

A district hospital was approved by the voters for Manhattan Beach at the last general election. Torrance was not concerned in the newly formed district although it is geographically included in the original boundaries of the district set up by the State of California which supplies Hill-Burton funds.

Richard Newton, field deputy for Supervisor Burton Chace explained Friday that the Boundary Commission is a primary hearing agency on such petitions. Action can only follow by a vote of the Board of Supervisors.

A campaign for the 125-bed Little Company of Mary Hospital is already under way. Site for the new building has been purchased on Torrance Blvd. Another privately financed hospital is scheduled for the Hollywood-Riviera section of Torrance.



