

'Sacrament' Named Topic This Sunday

The sermon on "Sacrament," emphasizing the great need of spiritual regeneration, will be read in all Christian Science churches Sunday.

Keynoting the Lesson-Sermon is the Golden Text from Psalms (24:3, 4), "Who shall ascend into the hill of the Lord? or who shall stand in His holy place? He that hath clean hands, and a pure heart; who hath not lifted up his soul unto vanity, nor sworn deceitfully."

Mark's account tells that following Jesus' ascension the disciples "went forth, and preached every where, the Lord working with them, and confirming the word with signs following" (16:20).

Mary Baker Eddy says in "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures": "The illuminations of Science give us a sense of the nothingness of error, and they show the spiritual inspiration of Love and Truth to be the only fit preparation for admission to the presence of the Most High" (p. 506).
