

Lack of Freeways in Area Hit by Cities

Concluding that the entire southwest section of the County faced a serious threat in the rapidly mounting traffic flows in the area, the sub-committee on the San Diego Freeway of the Inter-City Highway Committee this week moved to launch an all-out campaign to acquaint the area's representatives here, in Sacramento, and Washington of the crisis.

"From what we can determine now, the whole area appears to be facing the prospect of strangling in the traffic trying to use our inadequate roads and highways," Committee Chairman Nick Drale said after a Thursday luncheon with his group.

Drale pointed out that projected construction of freeways in the southwest area was so indefinite that an alarming situation was arising here on traffic matters.

The entire southwest area extending from Inglewood south has no freeway appropriations, members of the committee were told.

No dates for extension of the San Diego Freeway south of Venice Blvd. have been announced, extension of the Harbor Freeway southward into this area apparently is to be delayed, and the Inglewood freeway is still in the planning stages.

School Leader Hired
 A woman who has been active in nearly every phase of school work in Torrance will soon take on one part of the work that she has never tried before—that of classroom teaching. Mrs. Evelyn Carr, 1544 Marcelina Ave., one of the "mothers" of the Torrance Unified School District and a member of the first school board, has been hired by the present board of education as an elementary school teacher. She has not yet been assigned, but will begin work next month.

After nearly 10 years of lay participation in school activities, Mrs. Carr decided to return to college two years ago to get a teaching credential. Now that she has that degree, she is ready to go to work. She laughingly admits that her road to teaching was just the reverse of the path that most people take.

Infant Dies in Crib
 Two-month-old Robert Wayne Hancock was found dead in his crib Saturday morning, according to police. Reports indicated that the youngster was found by his mother, Mrs. George Hancock of 24012 Neece St., when she went to check him.

An attending physician, who said the infant had been dead for several hours, stated that the tot was somehow asphyxiated.

15 Tires Slashed
 Vandals who punctured 15 tires on 11 cars in the downtown area were being sought by police Saturday.

The tires were punctured while the cars were parked near the Prudential Insurance Co. building at Cravens and Marcelina Sts., a city parking lot at 1401 Cravens Ave., and behind the Chamber of Commerce building on Thursday.

Investigators said a pocket knife with a wide blade was used by the culprits, believed to be juveniles.
