Gardena Presbyterians Map \$306,000 Building Plans

With the initial unit to be a 6600-square-foot combined educational building and Fellowship Hall, the congregation of the Gardena Presbyterian Church is embarking on a \$306,000 construction program that will provide a four-building plant totaling 21,952 square feet.

The location is at Redondo Beach Blvd. and Ruth Ellen Ave.

Start of the program was announced by Rev. Truman Jolley, pastor, following acceptance of the architectural plans of Marion J. Varner, Pasadena, whose staff handled the designs.

North Torrance Members

Members of the congregation living in north Torrance will be served by the new facilities as well as those living in Gardena, states Rev. Jolley. This church's first building was erected in 1899 when the district was called Moneta.

The first structure will serve as a church school for 425 Sunday School children and will also be used as a Fellowship Hall. It will seat 200 for dining and 408 for lectures. There will be a platform for the latter.

Concrete tilt-up panels on a concrete slab floor will be the construction system, according to Varner. Roof support will consist of laminated arches.

Two Story Buildings Next in order for construction will be a two-story building to which all educational activities will be moved. This unit will contain 8150 square feet and its facilities will provide for first-grade children through the last year of high school. In addition, there will be rooms for nursery and kindergarten children.

'Soul' Named Lesson Topic This Sunday

"Unto thee, O Lord, do I lift up my soul... Shew me Thy ways, O Lord; teach me Thy paths," sang the Psalmist in the Golden Text of the Lesson-Sermon in all Christian Science churches Sunday (Psalms 25:1, 4). The subject of the Lesson-Sermon is "Soul," a word which, when capitalized, is used in Christian Science as one of the synonyms for God.

Scriptural selections will include the following from Matthew (15:30): "And great multitudes came unto Him, having with them those that were lame, blind, dumb, maimed, and many others, and cast them down at Jesus' feet; and He healed them."

Mary Baker Eddy in "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures": "Knowing that Soul and its attributes were forever manifested through man, the Master healer, the sick, gave sight to the blind, hearing to the deaf, feet to the lame, thus bringing to light the scientific action of the divine Mind on human minds and bodies and giving a better understanding of Soul and salvation" (p. 210).

DEDICATION OF HOPE CHURCH SLATED SUNDAY

Bishop Ira D. Warner will preside at dedication ceremonies to be held at Hope Evangelical United Brethren Church, 3343 W. 174th St., this Sunday at 3 p.m.

The building to be dedicated is the first unit of the church, which will include a sanctuary seating 800 people, educational facilities for some 1000 persons, and administrative offices. ADVENTISTS PROTESTING 'BLUE LAWS'

The Torrance Seventh-day Adventist Church Saturday took action to support its national organization in protesting the enactment or enforcement of "blue laws" protecting Sunday as a religious day.

Mrs. Sally Young, religious liberty secretary, presented to the church a statement from the denomination headquarters in Washington, D. C., reporting increased pressure for such laws in most states. The Seventh-day Adventist Church is the largest of seven.
