Ruffell's nine game efforts have run up a total of 188 points for a stellar 20.9 average. Whittier's Bill Van Vleit, who has appeared in 10 games, leads the race with a 21.4 average compiled from 214 points. Tied with Ruffell is Notre Dame's Tony Salas who has scored 209 points in 10 outings.

Ruffell's mark dominates the Bay League rankings by 38 points over runner-up Tom Bennett of Santa Monica. Torrance's Jerry Mathews is third in Bay League with a 15.9 average and 143 points. His effort is rated 17th in CIF.


