

Hampton Players to Stage Noel Coward Hit in March

Hampton Players' next show, "Present Laughter," by Noel Coward, will represent their initial step in breaking away from the old traditional proscenium arch and embarking on a new and exciting medium, horseshoe staging.

This is a type of presentation which is finding great favor with the habitual playgoer, as it gives the audience a feeling of being "in on things" — in this case, of sitting in the living room of a famous actor's London flat. And as one of the characters in the play itself says, "This is quite a peep behind the scenes!"

Stage Changed
For this particular production, part of the large auditorium, which is located above offices at 129 Pacific Ave. in Redondo Beach, will be curtained off to create an intimate little theater, with the audience sitting on three sides of the acting area. There will be a set on the fourth side, providing some of the atmosphere necessary to make us believe we are in a sumptuous and well appointed apartment. The spectators will feel that they could step inside the magic circle at any time and join the fun. (Hampton Players devoutly hope, however, that they will restrain this impulse.)

Mr. Coward has seen to it that there will indeed be a great deal of fun going on in that apartment, and his crisp wit crackles merrily throughout the entire play.

Farnsworth Returns
Bob Farnsworth, who returns to the fold to direct this show, is adding many delightful directorial touches which set off the clever dialogue to perfection, and the cast reports that it is an entertainment to watch his lively imagination at work.

Interpreting the role of Garry Essendine is C. J. (Jim) Reeves of Hollywood Riviera, who has done many fine parts for the Players. Garry, who affects a pose of world weary sophistication and insists that he wants quiet but thrives on scenes, romps through the play in a succession of elegant lounging robes and protests bitterly, but hollowly, that he finds himself constantly surrounded by attractive women.

Deadly Accurate
His ex-wife, Liz, played by Pat Rogers, tries to be a calm-

ing and levelling influence; his secretary, Monica, played by Dorothy Tunis, remains unperturbed by anything he says, however outrageous; and his manager's wife, Joanna, played by Diana Mitchell, moves in on him with the deadly accuracy of a completely self-confident and unscrupulous siren.

Daphne, played by Jean Maninger, brings the only touch of naivete to the scene, but even her hero-worshiping attitude becomes a trifle jaded as events progress. In the role of Garry's refreshingly impertinent valet, is Ronald Hellwell.

Miriam Wilson is his Swedish housekeeper with a startling flair for the occult; and Patricia Coates will be seen as Lady Saltburn, who might be deduced as a British Helen Hokinson girl. Several other male roles add their own individual audacities to the proceedings, and the play ends in a madly hilarious fashion.


