'Mind' Named Lesson Topic This Sunday

How spiritual understanding of God as divine Mind opens the way to greater abilities and opportunities will be brought out in all Christian Science services Sunday.

In the Lesson-Sermon on "Mind" a Bible citation from Ezra (7) relates that Artaxerxes, "the king granted him all his request, according to the hand of the Lord his God upon him. . . . For Ezra had prepared his heart to seek the law of the Lord, and to do it, and to teach in Israel statutes and judgments."

In a passage from "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" Mary Baker Eddy affirms: "A knowledge of the Science of being develops the latent abilities and possibilities of man. It extends the atmosphere of thought, giving mortals access to broader and higher realms. It raises the thinker into his native air of insight and perspicacity" (p. 128).

The Golden Text is from Romans (12:2): "Be not conformed to this world; but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God."

Rev. Northrup, Dean of Local Pastors, to Retire

The Rev. C. Miles Northrup, pastor of the First Baptist Church of Torrance for the past 22 years, will retire this month after more than 40 years in the ministry.

A farewell program will be held this Sunday afternoon at 2:30 p.m. in the sanctuary and fellowship hall of the church, 2118 W. Carson St.

The Rev. Nathan Bond, assistant pastor, will act as pastor until a successor is named.

Church Grows
When Rev. and Mrs. Northrup came to the local church in June, 1935, it was located in a small frame building valued at \$50,000, and had 201 members. Today, the church occupies a half-block and is valued at \$400,000. There are 1385 members.

Before coming to Torrance, Rev. Northrup served pastorates in Florida, Colorado, Arizona, and in Visalia and Burbank, California.

During Rev. Northrup's stay here, the First Baptist Church organized a Nisei church in 1940, and in 1944, was instrumental in developing the Mexican church in east Torrance. In April, 1954, the First Baptist Church was featured on the television program, "Great Churches of the Golden West."

18 in Church Work
Eighteen young people also have gone from the local church into some phase of full-time religious work during the past 22 years.

An ardent fisherman, both of souls and marine life, Rev. Northrup is undecided as to his future plans. He now lives at 1827 Androp Ave.
