Incorporation Signatures Hit By Civic League

Challenging the backers of incorporation for Lomita, to publish the names of incorporation petition signers, Herbert B. Brisbin, president of the Lomita Civic League, declared he had received reports that names were being signed without the owner's consent. Brisbin challenged the Lomita Chamber of Commerce and the Committee for the Incorporation of Lomita to publish the list immediately. "The Lomita Civic League has received many calls from Lomita citizens who have reasons to believe their names were signed to the petition by unauthorized persons. Only a person with power of attorney has the right to sign another person's name," he declared. "We have had reports of the petition canvasser actually signing the property owner's name." "If the signatures you turned in to the Board of Supervisors were all valid you have no reason not to fulfill this request," Brisbin said.

Tea to Open Jewish Drive In This Area

Motion picture and television actress Rosemary DeCamp and her husband, Judge John Shidler, will host a tea at their Hollywood Riviera home Sunday afternoon launching "Operation Shalom" — the 1957 United Jewish Welfare Fund campaign in this area.

Attending the event at 317 Camino de las Calinas will be UJWF campaign leaders headed by Southern Section Chairman Ella Schwartz, South Bay officials, and other civic leaders of South Bay communities, Palos Verdes, and Rolling Hills.

Guest speaker will be Raan-an Sivan, consul of Israel for the 11 western states. Sivan, a 35-year-old sixth generation Israeli, is a combat veteran of World War II and served as an Israel government official in Jerusalem during the Arab invasion of 1948.

Primary objective of the UJWF campaign this year is to raise funds to rescue 100,000 Jews from the terror of Europe's "Iron Curtain" countries, and the Arab states of Egypt and North Africa, noted Mrs. Schwartz. "Shalom means peace in Hebrew," said Mrs. Schwartz, "and we hope to bring peace and security to the victims of oppression — especially the children."

Heart Fund Drive to Hit Peak Sunday

The 1957 Heart Fund drive in Torrance will reach a peak on Feb. 24 when every neighborhood will have an opportunity to contribute to the fight against heart disease through their Heart Sunday volunteers.

Mrs. Olive Veach, local Heart Sunday chairman, said the theme for the fourth annual one-day collection is "Welcome Your Heart Fund Volunteer — and Give for Every Heart You Love."

The Heart Sunday task force, already more than 40,000 strong throughout Los Angeles County, is the largest in history of the neighborhood collection program.

"Volunteers, wearing official Heart Sunday tags, will leave educational literature at each door, and will offer householders an envelope in which they may place their contribution (checks preferred) and seal it before returning it to the volunteer. In this manner, the size of the gift remains confidential," Mrs. Veach said.
