Burley Gets New Position At National

Apartment Get Approval Of Council

The City Council approved a request for apartment zoning for 17 lots along Redondo Beach Blvd., near Ainsworth Ave., Tuesday, despite the opposition of two Planning Commissioners who appeared to oppose it.

The Council concurred with the 7-2 recommendation of the Planning Commission. The Planners held several stormy hearings on the request, presented by Wayne C. Nelson, with residents objecting to the apartment houses.

Planners John Mulvihill and Thurvin Fleetwood contended that the 50-foot lots are too small for four-family apartments. Four conditions were attached to the Council's approval, however, to make the project less objectionable to nearby residents.

Députies Nab Two Burglars

Two hungry burglars were nabbed in the act early yesterday morning at a Harbor City restaurant, according to sheriff's deputies.

Shortly after they had received a report that the Coast Inn Cafe, 1929 Pacific Coast Hwy., Lomita, had been burglarized, Deputies E. S. Olson and M. W. Garey spotted a car which fit the description in the other case in the 1500 block on Pacific Coast Hwy.

They found James Muldoon, 26, Wilmington, in the vehicle, and nabbed Tony de la Torre, 29, Wilmington, climbing out of a window at the Hare and Hounds, 1522 Pacific Coast Hwy. A third suspect fled in the darkness, despite warning shots fired by the deputies.

In the car and in possession of the men, deputies found \$23 in change, a \$35 malt mixing machine, a \$2-pound ham, gum, cigars, and cigarettes. Total value of the loot was set at \$77. They were booked on burglary charges at Lennox Sheriff's Station.

A neighbor who lives near the Coast Inn Cafe saw the men coming out of a window, and called the sheriffs, who nabbed the men almost immediately from the description of the car.
