Many Dump Fires Caused By Hot Ashes, Lucas Says

Local householders who dump hot ashes in the trash barrel just before the rubbish collector arrives are costing the city — and themselves — thousands of dollars a year, Fire Marshal Robert Lucas said Friday.

Torrance firemen answer several calls a month to the City Dump to put out fires in the trash there. Many of these fires are caused by hot ashes dumped in trash barrels, Lucas said.

"When they realize that the trash collector is coming that day, some people immediately clean out their incinerator or

fireplace and put it in the trash," he said. "If the ashes are hot, they may smolder for a while before they burst into flame, and by then they may be in the dump."

Trucks Blaze

Several times recently, rubbish trucks have caught fire enroute to the dump, he said.

Lucas cautioned residents not to dump hot ashes at any time—from fireplaces, incinerators, or barbecue pits. One recent garage fire was traceable to the fact that the owner dumped the coals from his barbecue into a cardboard box.

Douse Ashes

"It's a good idea to douse any ashes with water if there has been a recent fire," Lucas said, "or at least to let them

set overnight."

The erection of "no smoking" signs at the dump has helped to cut down the number of fires, but the presence of ashes in the trash cannot always be determined until a fire starts, Lucas said.

He estimated that dump fires may cost the city up to \$10,000 a year.

"The automatic pinspotters will have been cycled and tested and all checked out in adequate time for our opening," declare Alex Schreiber and his sons Max and Howard, owners and operators of the beautiful new family recreation center.

More than 25 contractors and subcontractors, under the supervision of Architect Arthur Froelich, have developed the 40,000 square foot project, which will have been fully completed according to schedule after seven months' planning and work.

New Features

Incorporated into the handsome structures are all of the latest innovations the public has come to expect and enjoy from a bowling establishment, plus a number of novel experimental accommodations which the Alex Schreiber and Family Enterprises have added as

a result of their experiences in the business in this area during the past seven years.

Unusual in many respects, Bowl-O-Drome offers for the first time to the Southern California bowling "open play" round the clock, plus a "free" kiddieland for youngsters and dancing for adults.

Hit On Formula

"We believe we've hit on a formula to offer, for the first time in what is predominantly a bowling establishment, some of the features the public will soon realize incorporates everything expected from a real community recreation center," Alex Schreiber said yesterday.

Bowl-O-Drome is the third link in the Schreiber chain, which also includes Paradise Bowl in Westchester and Victory Bowling Center in Van Nuys, and soon to include another 32-lane plant at Lakewood and Firestone.

Leagues Forming

Regular summer league bowling will start April 22 with an official "grand opening" program scheduled tentatively also next month.


