New Lutheran Church Formed

The Lutheran Church of the Good Shepherd, a new congregation of the Evangelical Lutheran Church and the National Lutheran Council, will open its activities next Sunday when the first worship service and Sunday School hour will be held in the cafeteria of the Anza Elementary School, 21400 Ellinwood Dr., according to the Rev. Gerald W. Garlid, pastor.

The enrollment session for Sunday School will be held at 9:30 a.m. with classes for young people and children from 3 years of age. An adult Bible class will be organized in the near future. Worship Planned Morning worship will follow at 10:45 when the pastor will speak on the theme "Life Can Be Yours." Participating in this initial service will be the choir of Christ the King Lutheran Church, directed by Walter Wittel. Mrs. Leon Alderman will be the pianist. During the worship service a nursery will be provided for children to 3 years of age.

Established by decision of its sponsoring bodies, the new congregation has been assigned an area of responsibility in west Torrance and Redondo Beach. In preparation for its opening Sunday a program of visitation has been conducted the last six weeks by parish workers supplied by the California District of the Evangelical Lutheran Church with the cooperation of congregations in the area.

In the near future a site for the church structure will be purchased, with the construction of the first unit to follow. The parsonage and church office are located at 22924 Carlow Rd., Torrance.
