

Annual Red Cross Drive in Torrance at Half-Way Mark

Reports on the American Red Cross 1957 fund campaign finds the Torrance Red Cross barely inching into the upper one-third of the 52 branches in the Los Angeles chapter with a collection of \$6859 or 57 per cent of their goal. This showing in spite of the fact that most of the residential and business workers have not yet turned in their reports, is due to the excellent collections of the commerce and industry committee under Scott F. Albright of National Supply Co. Albright's committee has turned in more than 70 per cent of their quota at the present time and it is this amount of money to the credit of the Torrance organization which brings the average up to 57 per cent.

Drive Pushed
 The residential and small business volunteer workers are being urged to complete their solicitations before the end of March.

Other reports show the Lomita branch of the Red Cross with 78 per cent of its quota collected, and reports from Gardena indicate that they have over 98 per cent of their quota and will be over the top in another day. Whether Gardena is the first of the branches over the top is a neck and neck race with Northside branch, but Gardena's Red Cross fund chairman, Mrs. R. R. Knapp, says that they will top all of the others by having the highest percentage of their quota when the campaign ends.

Gruenther Wires
 Emphasizing the need for a stepped-up tempo in the current Red Cross drive, over-all Chairman John W. Lühring revealed receipt of an "all-points" bulletin from General Alfred M. Gruenther, president of the American National Red Cross in Washington, D.C., urging all chapters to push for "over-the-top" standing to "insure a steadily expanding blood program."

In a wire here, Gen. Gruenther pointed out that the cost of the blood program for the 1957-58 fiscal year will be increased to \$612,000.

High Cost of Signals Hit By Supervisor

An investigation which he had requested into the rising costs of traffic signals has already resulted in more competitive bidding on traffic signal installations, Supervisor Kenneth Hahn reported this week.

Concerned over reports that there had been a 67 per cent increase in cost of traffic signals during the past three years and the fact that only five firms regularly bid on county signal installations, Supervisor Hahn requested County Road Commissioner Sam R. Kennedy to make a detailed check on the reasons for the increases.

"Since the overall cost of the signals had increased much more than had the cost of the labor and materials used in installing the signals, I felt that there was some basis for a complete investigation," Supervisor Hahn declared.

He pointed out that the cost of installing fixed time signals had increased from an average of \$2640 an intersection in 1954 to \$4428 in 1957.

Subsequent to the cost investigation, two new companies have begun bidding on county traffic signal jobs.

"Think it is very obvious that two additional bidders on traffic signals, right after the investigation, shows that the price increases were not justified and were due largely to lack of competition," Supervisor Hahn stated.

PV Kiwanians Pledge Aid To Red Cross

The Red Cross fund campaign took the spotlight at last week's meeting of the Palos Verdes Kiwanis Club as members made a contribution of \$50 towards the Peninsula's goal of \$8000.

Matt Brunning, business chairman in the local fund effort, accepted the check from Larry Lindgren, club treasurer. Also taking part in the presentation were Earl Fields, club president, and Robert Muncaster, area chairman of the Peninsula's Red Cross appeal.

According to Fields, total Red Cross fund-raising efforts being waged by the organization with the cooperation of community merchants and residents are expected to produce "more than \$100."

Extending his sincere appreciation to his fellow members for their "extensive efforts," Muncaster reported that the fully organized contingent of volunteer solicitors taking part in the local campaign have thus far raised a total of \$3199—40 per cent of the total goal.

"Generous cooperation such as this will lend immeasurable assistance to the eventual successful outcome of our Red Cross appeal," asserted the fund chairman, while indicating that volunteers—in the face of difficult and unexpected obstacles—have been persistent in their canvassing efforts.

"Continued teamwork among volunteers, organizations and residents will carry us over the top of our goal, I am sure," declared Muncaster in conclusion.

Bowling for Housewives Scheduled

For housewives who are looking for some exercise and the chance to participate in a morning program, the Torrance Recreation Department yesterday announced a bowling league for housewives. This will begin on Wednesday, April 24.

The first day will be devoted to bowling instruction and the formation of teams.
