
It marked the first organizational meeting for the new hospital, which is scheduled to

## New Bowl-O-Drome To Open Tomorrow

Southern California's newest and finest family recreation center—the million-dollar Bowl-O-Drome at 220th St. and Western Ave. in Torrance—will be opened to the general public tomorrow night at 6 o'clock.

Equipped with the American Machine and Foundry automatic pin-spotters and under-lane-single T ball returns, the Torrance facility is certain to be classified with the most handsome bowling plants in the area.

Managed and controlled by Max, 30, and Howard, 22, the Schreiber Family currently also operates the 24-lane Victory Bowling Center in Van Nuys and previously built Paradise Bowl in Westchester.

Now on the drawing board and planned for completion later this year is another Schreiber Family Enterprise at Lakewood and Firestone in Downey.

**An Eye Opener**  
"When we open our doors—you will open your eyes," is the pledge of Bowl-O-Drome. It is a 40,000-square-foot building that incorporates all of the usual innovations and features, plus billiards, coffee shop, cocktail lounge and a free, supervised nursery and playground.

Certain to gain approval are facilities for the free parking of more than 350 cars, both

in front and alongside the modern plant.

Bowlingwise, Andy Anderson, formerly of Westlake Academy and Arcadia Bowling Courts, will be in charge of a staff which includes Robert Lee and Ernest Chaltraw.

**Instruction Offered**  
Bob Prince, member of the Greater Los Angeles All-Star League and a graduate of the "Certified Instructors' School," will be on hand to provide free bowling instruction. He will be on the job daily, except Saturdays and Sundays, from 10 a.m. until 5 p.m.

Regular league activity is not scheduled to begin until April 22, but "open play" will be available at all times, the Schreibers insist.

A formal grand opening will be announced later.

Bowl-O-Drome is the first new bowling establishment built in Torrance in the past 17 years. It was started last Aug. 13 and more than 300 individuals representing firms from Los Angeles, Torrance, Fontana, Inglewood, Sherman Oaks, El Monte, Bell, Huntington Park, Culver City, Pasadena, Long Beach, and Compton assisted in the construction and development.

More than 60 employees will be on hand daily to provide the utmost in service and facilities in a wholesome, comfortable surrounding.
