Kindergarten Roundups Set At 5 Schools

Roundups of children who will enter kindergarten at local schools for the first time next fall will be held soon for youngsters in the Riviera, Parkway, Sepulveda, Howard Wood, and Torrance elementary school districts.

Parents of children who will be five years old before Dec. 2 are asked to bring their children to the schools for preliminary registration. A birth certificate or other proof of birth date is necessary. The schedule is as follows:

Riviera and Parkway Schools - registration at Riviera School, 365 Paseo de Arena. Children living east of Monte D'Oro register on Wednesday, May 8, while those living west register on Thursday, May 9.

Registration forms are available at the school office for those who cannot make it on those days. Sepulveda School, 4600 Merrill St. Enrollment will be on Tuesday and Thursday, May 7 and 9. Parents should get enrollment blanks beforehand and make appointments for a physical exam by the school doctor.

Howard Wood School, 2250 W. 235th St. Registration will be on May 8, 10, and June 7. Parents should call the school, DA 6-6061, or write for an enrollment blank and appointment for examination by the school doctor.

Torrance Elementary School, 2005 Martina Ave. Registration will be on Monday and Tuesday, May 15 and 16. Parents may call the school, FA 8-7177, or come to the school office for forms and appointment with the doctor.

Parents Seek \$51,200 For Drowned Son

The parents of three-year-old Johnny Williams, who drowned last Nov. 8 in a west Torrance lagoon, have filed a \$51,200 damage suit against the Family Land Co. and the Kauffman-Wilson Construction Co. in Inglewood Superior Court.

Mr. and Mrs. Jay R. Williams, 5033 Scott St., claimed that the fence around the lagoon was not properly maintained and that an open gate into the area was unguarded. The lagoon is located near the intersection of Palos Verdes and Torrance Bldgs.

The little boy's body was found at the bottom of the lagoon, after his mother reported that he was missing. Francis searchers had combed the area for him before he was finally discovered in about three feet of water. He apparently slipped off the edge of the embankment while playing.
