

Deadline Told For Veterans Tax Exemption

Veterans who wish to claim the \$1,000 tax exemption on their property must file their request before May 28 according to the Torrance Veterans Service Center.

If the ownership of the property is recorded at the County Recorder's Office in the county where the property is located before March 5, the veteran has until noon, May 28, to file his request for exemption. The filing period officially begins on March 5.

The tax exemption must be applied for each year and applies on \$1,000 of real or personal property provided that neither the veteran or his wife own property with an assessed valuation of \$5,000 or more.

Eligibility
Veterans of any war or campaign are eligible if they are honorably discharged and active members of the armed forces are eligible.

Under certain conditions the exemption may be granted to a widow of pensioned parent or a veteran according to the Service Center.

Army of Thousands to Ask Funds for Heart Campaign

An army of several thousand volunteers swarm through Los Angeles County communities at 8 p.m. Sunday—Heart Sunday—to collect for the 1956 Heart Fund campaign.

Thomas Craig, Heart Sunday chairman, issued two final appeals to the 186 communities of the County in which volunteers will call—rain or shine—during the three-hour collection period of from 8 to 11 p.m.

"Welcome your Heart Sunday volunteer as honored guests for they are giving an hour or more of their time to call on you in behalf of your heart. Open your heart and give generously to help continue the fight against diseases of the heart and blood vessels."

"If the volunteer misses you, contributions may be mailed to HEART, in care of your Postmaster."

Reserves Sought
Craig pointed out that experience of the two previous around-the-block Heart Sunday collections conducted in most communities, showed that unforeseeable emergencies such as illness prevented some workers from their calls. In such cases, efforts will be made to fill in with reserves.

Mayors of some communities have issued statements of proclamation or endorsement on Feb. 26 as Heart Sunday. Many clergymen will issue appeals from their pulpits on Sunday morning.

Clergymen Join Drive
In the Boyle Heights area, Craig said, clergymen from a dozen churches of all faiths have recruited Heart Sunday marchers from their congregations.

Under leadership of Tommy

T. Ochi, Heart Fund chairman for the Japanese community of Los Angeles, 100 Heart Sunday volunteers will call on the homes of Japanese citizens.

Craig reminded residents that official Heart Sunday volunteers will be adults only and will be recognized by their identification cards, lapel tags, gift envelopes and receipts. Social Service Commission cards must be displayed.

Women Head List
"An impressive number of the Heart Sunday volunteers will be physicians, life insurance underwriters and businessmen. In some cases, they may be your banker, your grocer or your postman. Most of the workers will be women," Craig said.

Upon urging a cordial welcome for the Heart Sunday volunteer, Craig added: "In an almost literal sense, Heart Sunday may well be regarded as a Memorial Day to a majority of those of our loved ones who have passed away in recent years. This seems appropriate because more than half of all deaths are due to diseases of the heart and circulation, and because there is no more effective way to make a lasting tribute than through a gift to the Heart Fund."

Third Goal
Craig said Heart Sunday gifts should contribute nearly one-third of the total \$750,000 goal needed to conduct the year-around program activities of the local Heart Association.

"The \$750,000 budget represents the minimum needed to support local commitments for research, education and other community services aimed at reducing the toll of death and disability due to heart disease," Craig said.


Club to Install
