Chace Honored For His Work In Harbor Area

Special honors for what they term "outstanding service to his district" were conferred upon County Supervisor Burton W. Chace Tuesday by representatives of the Harbor District Chambers of Commerce. At Tuesday's meeting of the board of supervisors Lew Griffiths, president of the Harbor Chambers of Commerce, and Judge Irving P. Austin, a director of the same organization, presented Chace with a lifetime membership in the organization.

In making the presentation Griffiths pointed out that Chace during his tenure of of-

face as a supervisor "has been responsible for an outstanding number of badly needed civic improvements in the entire harbor area." Griffiths paid particular tribute to Chace for the supervisor's work on the Dominguez flood control channel, highway improvement in the district and what he called "Chace's leadership in obtaining state funds for the purchase of Royal Palms Beach Park and other badly needed recreation areas." Supervisor John Anson Ford, speaking for the other members of the board, told Griffiths and the other representatives of the harbor chambers, "You are paying a well deserved tribute to Supervisor Chace." Ford said that in the more than 20 years

that he had served on the board of supervisors it was his opinion that Chace had done more for the development of the beach recreation program than any other supervisor in the history of the county.


