

New Committee Suggested for Study of Parks

(The following items are reprinted from the Monday, April 9, HERALD.)

The question on what the city should do in the way of a central park and neighborhood park sites will receive the attention of still another committee if the recommendations of the Planning Commission are approved by the City Council next week.

The recommendation to set up a new committee, composed of two Planning Commission members, two Recreation Commissioners, and one member each from the Industries Tax Committee, and Coordinating Council, was approved by the planners here Wednesday night. A seventh member to represent organized labor was added at the last minute at the insistence of Commissioner Triffin Fleetwood.

Lawyers Back Shidler

A committee of lawyers, many of whom have represented cases before him, has announced its support of Judge John A. Shidler for reelection to Superior Court, Office No. 28, vacated recently by the retirement of Judge Georgia Bullock.

College Growth Cited

The record growth of El Camino College to 2,168 full course students and more than 4,000 part-time and adult attendants was cited before the Torrance Rotary Club Thursday evening by Dr. William Harless, director of education for the college.

Building Sets Pace

It was the same song with two choruses last month as Torrance construction permits continued to set a record-breaking pace.

Permits for new construction representing a total valuation of \$2,937,828 were issued by the city's Building Department, according to Walter G. Bradford.

The permits brought the 1956 total to a record \$14,602,415. At the same time last year the city had issued only \$8,650,928 in permits.

Prisoner Escapes

A Torrance man who was picked up in the recent cleanup of narcotic users and peddlers in the county, escaped from an El Monte courtroom Friday where he was facing a hearing on the charges.

Fedro Gallardo, 27, of 2122 208rd St., who was arrested along with about 200 Southlanders on charges of narcotics violation, escaped from custody of sheriff's deputies. He was in court to face hearing on the violation, when he suddenly made a break and got away, sheriff's officials said.

Hahn Flays Board

Supervisor Kenneth Hahn severely disagreed last week with the policy of the other four supervisors in using gas tax funds to pay for a \$2,900,000 office building for road department employees.

"This money, which is raised for the improvement of roads, should be spent in building badly-needed new roads, improving an existing existing roads and installing traffic signals and other safety devices," Supervisor Hahn declared.

Strike Record Better in March

March ended with only two strikes in progress and 378 employees out in the Los Angeles area, the Merchants and Manufacturers Assn. announced in its monthly industrial relations roundup.

During March 10 strikes were active with 2094 employees out and 19,325 man-days lost. All were settled except the two which had been in progress five days when the month ended.

This compares with eight work stoppages, 2306 employees out, and 31,513 man-days lost in February.

Four of the March strikes were carried over from February and six began in March.

Of the total, six were called by AFL unions and four by the CIO.
