

Fire Maniac Blamed for School Blaze

(The following stories are reprinted in part from the Monday, April 12, issue of The HERALD.)

Fire bugs are blamed by arson officials at Lennox sheriff's station for a fire that caused an estimated \$25,000 damage early Saturday at Narbonne High School in Lomita.

Matches found at the scene of the blaze gave the arson detail positive evidence of the origin of the fires, which were set in different areas of the main administration building.

The school has been the target of a series of minor blazes in the past few months. Student lockers, trash barrels and other receptacles have been set on fire from time to time by arsonists, deputies have reported.

Authorities received their first call to the scene at about 8:12 a.m. County Fire Department Engine companies 6, 36, 54 and 99 responded to the calls.

Separate fires were started in the fine arts room, the student store, and two other areas of the main building. One of the fires was set on the second floor, but the main damage was suffered by the blaze that began in the student store.
