Castoff articles which the trucks pick up will be reconditioned in workshops of the Salvation Army Social Service Center which serves this area. This process provides a social rehabilitation program for needy and handicapped men. Brigadier William J. Parkins, manager of the big center, said the program requires a constant inflow of usable materials such as clothing, shoes, furniture, dishes, mattresses, bedding, kitchen utensils, home appliances, silverware stoves, radios, rugs, rugs books and bric-a-brac.




Christie At Fort Lewis




