





 help from the Eisenhower Administration.
 "You can't farm surplus around the neck of the farmer," he said. He recommends use of surplus commodities to strengthen school lunch programs and for feeding the vast underfed areas of the world.
His Big Business
 The campaigning senator also took a poke at "big business," saying that everything is getting bigger and bigger and in

the hands of fewer and fewer. "It alarms me," he stated. "I don't want it to get to the point where everybody works for the federal government or for a huge corporation. To prevent this, he favors strengthening the antitrust laws, changing government procurement methods, and giving the small businessman a tax break.
 Kefauver was accompanied to Torrance by his wife, Nancy, and J. Edward McGrath, former attorney general and chairman of the Democratic Committee. He was introduced by Supervisor Kenneth Hahn.
