Health Studies At North High Being Examined

In an effort to determine how well, how much, and in what classes health is being taught, a committee of teachers under the chairmanship of Carl Ahee, vice principal, is currently completing a study of the problem at North High School.

Various aspects of health education were first established as belonging in the high school program: anatomy, physiology, heredity, diet and nutrition, safety, diseases, first aid, mental health, recreation, vocations, and alcohol and narcotics. The total high school program was then surveyed and the different classes in which some or all of these aspects of health education are being taught were identified.

It was found that some health was taught not only in boys' and girls' physical education and in home-making, but also in life science, industrial arts, freshman problems, world heritage, and contemporary history. The committee plans now to evaluate the program in order to avoid unnecessary overlapping of subject matter.

When the study is completed, North High School should have as strong a health education program for its students as any high school in the state, Ahee said.


