




SAXONS EDGE LOOP FOE IN EXTRA FRAME

North High tallied once in the home half of the eighth inning Tuesday to down Morningside, 8-7, in a Pioneer League close.
 Coach Del Nuzum's boys rapped out 12 hits off Monarch hurler Bob Quinn to gain the win.
 Morningside took a temporary 3-0 lead in the top of the first when they got three quick runs. But the Saxons tallied four in their half of the initial frame to take over the lead.
 A pair of tallies by the visitors put the count at 5-4 in the third and they stretched their lead to 7-4 by counting once in each of the fourth and fifth frames.
 A three-run rally by the Saxons in the fifth tied up the contest and set the stage for the extra-inning rally by the locals.
 Ernie Thomsen started on the mound for the Saxons but didn't last out the first inning. Tony Treese took over and tolled until he was relieved by Bob Skinner in the fifth. Skinner shut out the Monarchs for the final three frames to get credit for the win.

Smack Samohi To Take 1st Place Flag

Torrance's first Bay League flag in golf is in the bag as the driving Tartars downed Samohi by a 263-306 count at Palos Verdes Golf Club Monday afternoon.
 The win gave Coach Joe Stuart's boys an 8-1 league record with a make-up match to be played against Redondo High at PVGC tomorrow, but which has no bearing on the final standings as the Tartars have now outdistanced their closest rivals, Leuzinger.
 Low men for the locals were Denny Stewart and Jerry Thrall, each carding 89's. Additional support was given by Bill LaDuke and Doug Mills with 45's; Bruce Bielefeld, 46, and Ron Hase, 49.
 This is the first Bay League golfing title for Torrance since 1951, when the Tartars won the title for the first time in six years ago.
 After Friday's match with Redondo the Tartars move on to the Brookside course in Pasadena, and the CIF matches.
 Stuart announced that his six-man squad for the Pasadena matches will consist of Stewart, Thrall, LaDuke, Terry Murphy, Bielefeld and Hase.
 Last stumbling block in the Tartars' drive for the Bay League crown was removed last Friday when they downed Leuzinger, 268-269, for the Olympians' second defeat of the season which, coupled with a tie, eliminated them from title contention.
 Letters with "Champs" on them were given to the titlists.

Local Spikers In CIF Semi Final Meet
 The CIF semi-final track and field meet is set for Compton Saturday, with both Torrance and North High sending representatives to the affair.
 Only one Saxon spiker, Cee high jumper Gil Garnica, has qualified for the meet. He topped the qualifying height of 5'6" easily last week at Long Beach Poly High School. Coach Willard Morgan will accompany Garnica.
 Torrance will send speedster Gary Cooke in the 100 and 220 yard dashes, Myron Schmidt in the 440, and a four-man 880 yard relay team of Cooke, Skip Smith, Tom Brown and Schmidt, in the Varsity going.
 Cooke came in second in his 100 heat last week at Santa Monica, while he sped to the easy 440 win in the 220, high Foynter of Pasadena, cruised to a 20.8 clocking in his 220 heat at Samohi.
 Ben entries for Torrance are Len Ehlers, 1320 run, and Larry Denning, pole vault.
 Tartaraces also in the CIF running are George Boscon, Gary Vom Steeg, Jim Patrick and Dennis Lupin, 440-yard relay team members, and a shot putter Bill Morris.
 Field events start at 1 p.m. with the track events set for 1:30. Top three qualifiers in each event will go on to the CIF finals at Inglewood.
