Seventh-day Adventists from Torrance will transfer their regular weekly worship service to the site of the 54th annual Camp Meeting, at 4100 Imperial Hwy., Lynwood.

Last Saturday the local church congregation met for worship during the opening days of the annual 11-day religious convention at the camp site, and this week they will repeat the procedure. "Our church members are enjoying a heartening spiritual uplift as a result of this great meeting," Pastor Glenn L. Goffar reported yesterday from the camp grounds where he is serving as an official of the Camp Meeting Committee. "This type of spiritual fellowship to study the great truths of the Bible stimulates a greater religious experience in the individual than almost any other type of activity," he said. Pastor Goffar issued a special invitation to Torrance residents to be guests of the local Adventist church at the Saturday morning worship services of the convocation. Highlighting services will be an address by Dr. Frank H. Vost, Washington, D. C., a world official of the Seventh-day Adventist church, on "The Love of God." Dr. Vost is also presenting a series of sermons at 11 a.m. each day on "The Atonement" of Christ. Youth of the local church congregation and guests will meet in five huge tents at the camp site for the Saturday morning services. At the senior youth tent, more than 2,500 teen-agers will hear George E. Vandeman, Washington, D. C., associate world director of the church's ministerial association, in a religious address especially prepared for youth.
