Torrance CAP Personnel In Apple Valley Training Film

Participation in photographic coverage of the Civil Air Patrol in action on search and rescue missions gave the status of "movie stars" to personnel of South Bay Squadron 43 at the recent Long Beach Group 7 Training Mission at Apple Valley.

Acting on a request from the national headquarters of Civil Air Patrol for additional movie footage for the United States Air Force film library, Lt. Col. Davis C. Cochran, of Torrance, Long Beach group commander, ordered personnel and equipment to establish base headquarters and facilities as though on an emergency call from the Air Rescue Service of the USAF.

"Eyed" by the movie camera preparations in the establishment of radio communications, medical facilities, ground search and rescue, and the housing and feeding of more than 125 personnel depicted the constant effort and training of Civil Air Patrol in perfecting efficient and thorough training in search and rescue techniques.






