These two Torrance High school youngsters had won the regional and state honors which entitled them to enter the national championship contest.

They, with their parents and Carol Stout of Orange, drove to Virginia to enter the competition which was held from July 26 to Aug. 2.

Peggy won the national trophy in the Junior girls singles and Robbie was proclaimed champion in the intermediate men's singles. Robbie and Carol Stout won the top honors in the novice pairs contest.

Both of the local champions have been skating for the past six years. They spend from 8 to 12 hours daily at the Long Beach Hippodrome.



Voting and Conventions League Topic

Representatives of both major political parties gave a delegate's view of a national political convention and voting qualifications and registration rules were reviewed at a meeting of the League of Women Voters of Palos Verdes Estates held Wednesday evening, Aug. 15, at the Palos Verdes Library.

Anyone who has recently become a citizen or attained the age of 21 or has moved to California since the last general election must register. A person who has moved, changed his party affiliation, or who did not vote in either the primary or general election of 1954 must re-register. Persons who will become a citizen, or reach the age of 21 before Nov. 1 of this year may register between Sept. 3 and 13. The registration deadline for everyone is Sept. 13.

Cliff Hix, San Pedro attorney, talked from his experiences as a delegate to the Republican conventions of 1940 and 1952 and explained the party procedures and activities in the months prior to a national convention.

The former mayor of Redondo Beach, Charles Wortham, served as a delegate to the Democratic conventions of 1948 and 1952. Mr. Wortham discussed the historical background of conventions as they have evolved from party caucus systems and primary elections which many states now have.
